#### 3 steps to listening to music

Be sure to charge the battery before you use your Walkman for the first time. You can transfer music while charging the battery. You can listen to your music as soon as the transfer has completed.







1. Connect your Walkman to a computer.

You can charge the battery by connecting your Walkman via a USB connection to a computer that is turned on and running.

2. Import music to your computer and transfer the music to your Walkman.



#### Parts and controls

This section explains the functions of buttons, jacks, and other parts of your Walkman.



#### 1. Headphone jack

Insert the headphone plug until it clicks into place. Sound will be impaired if the headphones are not connected properly.

#### 2. RESET button

Press the RESET button with a pen or paper clip, etc. to reset your Walkman. While the Walkman is connected to the computer via USB, you cannot reset the Walkman.

3. VOL + (\*1)/- buttons

Press to adjust the volume.

4. BACK/HOME button

Press to go up one list screen level or to return to the previous menu. Press and hold to display the Home menu.

- 5. Display
- 6. **►**II (\*1) button

Executes the desired items. Starts/pauses music playback, or pauses/restarts recording.

7. **◄**◀ / **▶** button

Press to select a menu item, start fast-rewinds/forwards during playback, or preset an FM station.

8. USB cap

Before you connect your Walkman to your computer, remove the USB cap.

- 9. USB connector
- 10. Strap holes

Use to attach a strap (not supplied).

#### 11. HOLD switch

Disables the operation buttons to avoid accidental operation while carrying your Walkman.

#### Charging the battery

Charge your Walkman by connecting it to a computer.



- 1. Remove the USB cap.
- 2. Connect your Walkman to a running computer via USB.

  The battery status icon shows when charging is complete.

  It takes about 70 minutes to fully charge the battery.
- 3. Disconnect your Walkman from the computer when charging is complete.

#### Hint

- You can check the remaining battery charge in the music playback and the FM radio screens.
- When you charge your Walkman when it has not been used for a long period of time or when you use it for the first time, your computer may not recognize it, or nothing may appear on the screen. The Walkman should start operating normally again after charging for about 10 minutes.

# Extending the battery life

You can reduce battery consumption by using your Walkman as follows.

For a comparison of battery life based on set effects, default settings and functions, see "Battery life."

- Turn off the power manually.
- Set a shorter time in [Screen Off Timer].
- Adjust screen brightness.
- Turn off the operation sounds.
- · Set all sound quality settings to off.

# Notes on charging the battery

- Charging time differs depending on battery usage conditions.
- If the battery life is reduced to about half of its normal life even if sufficiently charged, it has probably worn out. Please contact your nearest Sony dealer.
- If you charge your Walkman when it has not been used for a long period of time, your computer may not recognize it, or the Walkman may not respond. Charge the Walkman for about 10 minutes, after which it should start operating normally again.
- When □ is displayed on the screen, the ambient temperature exceeds the recommended range and charging is forcibly stopped. Charge the battery in an ambient temperature of between 5 °C to 35 °C.
- The number of times the battery can be recharged from complete discharge is approximately 500 times. This number may vary depending on the conditions under which you use your Walkman.
- Charge the battery at least once every six months to a year even if you do not use your Walkman for a long period of time.
- Charging is not guaranteed with homebuilt or modified computers.
- Operation with a USB port extended with a USB hub is only guaranteed when a self-powered USB hub that carries an authorized logo is used.
- Do not leave your Walkman connected for an extended period of time to a laptop computer that is not connected to an AC power supply. Doing so may discharge the computer's battery.
- Do not turn on, restart, wake up from sleep mode, or shut down the computer with your Walkman connected to the
  computer via USB. Doing so may cause the Walkman to malfunction. Disconnect the Walkman from the computer
  before conducting these operations.
- Your Walkman may become hot while charging. This is not a malfunction.
- You cannot operate your Walkman when it is connected to a computer.
- You cannot operate your Walkman while charging the battery.
- The battery indicator scales are not equal. Refer the battery indicator as a guide.
- [Do not disconnect] is displayed when transferring data between your Walkman and the computer. Do not disconnect the Walkman from your computer when [Do not disconnect] is displayed. Doing so may result in loss of the data being transferred and data on the Walkman.

Importing music from media using Windows Media Player

You can use Windows Media Player to import music from your CDs. Follow these instructions to import music from a CD to your computer.



- 1. Insert an audio CD.
- 2. Start up Windows Media Player, and then click the "Rip" tab at the top of the window. When the computer is connected to the Internet, Windows Media Player obtains CD information (CD title, song name or artist name, etc.), and displays it in the window.
- 3. Click "Start Rip."

  Windows Media Player begins to import the CD. The imported music is indicated as "Ripped to library." Wait until all songs have been imported.



# Transferring content using Windows Media Player

You can use Windows Media Player to transfer content such as music from your computer to your Walkman.



- 1. Start up Windows Media Player, and then connect your Walkman to your computer via USB.
- 2. Click the "Sync" tab on the Windows Media Player window.
- 3. Drag-and-drop the desired songs to the Sync List on the right side of the window. The songs are added to the Sync List.
- 4. Click "Start Sync" to start synchronization.

  When synchronization is completed, a message confirming you can disconnect your Walkman appears on the Sync List. After completion, close Windows Media Player, and disconnect the Walkman from the computer.

- You can also transfer content directly from Windows Explorer to your Walkman by drag-and-drop.



Content such as music can be directly transferred by drag-and-drop using Windows Explorer.



- 1. Connect your Walkman to a running computer via USB.
- 2. Open the "WALKMAN" folder using the procedure below that corresponds to your computer.
  - Windows 7 or earlier:
     From the "Start" menu of Windows, click "Computer" or "My Computer" and open the "WALKMAN" folder.
  - Windows 8 or Windows 8.1:
     Select "Desktop" from the "Start screen" to open "File Explorer." From the "Computer" list, open the "WALKMAN" folder.
- 3. Open the folder to which you want to transfer files.

  To transfer music files or folders: "MUSIC" folder
- 4. Drag-and-drop the desired files or folders (1) to the applicable folder (2) in the "WALKMAN" folder.

- Only MP3/WMA files can be played on your Walkman.
- Do not change folder name or delete the "MUSIC" folder.
- Some songs may not be played back on your Walkman due to copyright protection.
- Do not disconnect your Walkman while the data is transferred. Otherwise, data being transferred or stored on the Walkman may be damaged. If the Walkman is disconnected while files are being transferred, unnecessary files may be left in the Walkman. In this case, transfer usable files back to the computer and format the Walkman.







# Playing music

Play music imported to your Walkman.

- 2. Press the 2 button to select the desired search method. Select the desired items until a song list appears, then select the desired song.
- 3. Press the 1 button to play the song.

Volume operation (Only for countries/areas complying with European and Korean Directives)

An alarm (beep) and a warning [Check the volume level] are meant to protect your ears when you turn the volume up to a level which is harmful for your ears for the first time. You can cancel the alarm and warning by pressing any button.

# Note

- · You can turn up the volume after canceling the alarm and warning.
- After the initial warning, the alarm and warning repeat for every 20 cumulative hours that the volume is set to a level which is harmful for your ears; when this happens, the volume is turned down automatically.
- If the volume is set to a level which is harmful for your ears and you turn off the Walkman, the volume is turned down to a level which is safe for your ears automatically.





To play/pause

The following descriptions are important for using your Walkman. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

- Do not touch the rechargeable battery with bare hands if it is leaking. Consult your nearest Sony dealer if the battery
  has leaked, as battery liquid may remain in your Walkman. If the liquid gets into your eyes, do not rub your eyes as
  this may lead to blindness. Wash out your eyes with clean water and consult a doctor.

- If you see lightning or hear thunder, take off the headphones immediately and refrain from using your Walkman.
- If you experience an allergic reaction to the supplied headphones, stop using them immediately and contact a doctor.

# Notes on usage environment

- Never use your Walkman where it will be subjected to extreme light, temperatures, humidity or vibration. For example, never leave the Walkman in a car parked in the sun or in direct sunlight. It may become discolored, distorted or damaged.

If your Walkman does not function as expected, try the following steps to resolve the issue.

Before resetting your Walkman, disconnect the Walkman from your computer and check that no content such as music is being played back, otherwise the data may be damaged. You can then reset the Walkman safely.



- 1. Check the topic on the issue in "Troubleshooting."
- 2. Connect your Walkman to your computer to charge the battery. You may be able to resolve some issues by charging the battery.
- 3. Press the 1 button with a pen or paper clip, etc. to reset your Walkman.
- 4. Check information on the issue in the help of the software having problems.
